### The Sahara

The Sahara covers one quarter of the African continent and is the world's largest hot desert. Its many different landscapes have Arabic names.

About 20% of the Sahara is covered by **ergs**, sand deserts. Sand deserts are made of sand which was blown out of hamadas and serirs.

Stony and rocky deserts are called **hamada**. About 70% of the Sahara is covered by hamadas. How did they form? It is very hot during the day, but cold at night. That means

the rocks are also very hot during the day but very cold at night. The change of heat and cold makes the rocks split apart. This process is called **insolation weathering**.

Deserts develop when the finer sand is blown out by the wind. These large areas are covered with gravel. In Arabic they are called **serir**.

**Wadis** are valleys which are usually dry all year round. When it rains they quickly fill with fast flowing rivers.

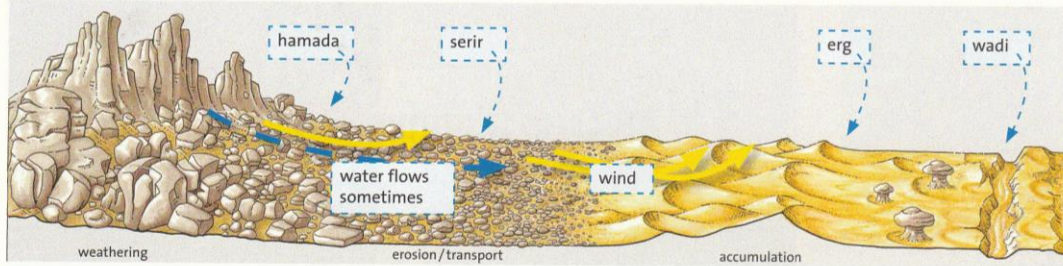

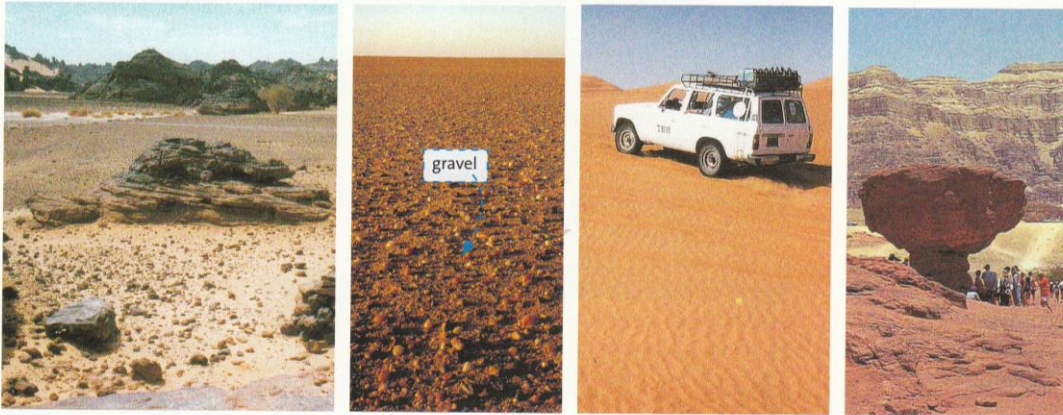

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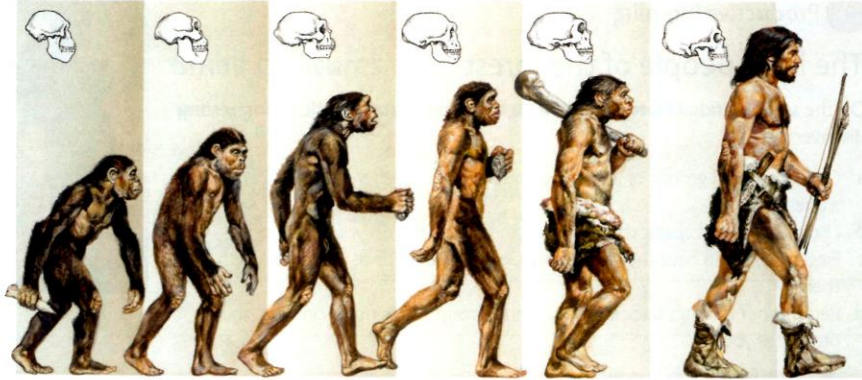

Text A: A new species?
